Residency Program Information

The University of Virginia Health System (UVaHS) has 6 ASHP-accredited residency programs: PGY2-Critical Care (established 2002), PGY2-Drug Information (established 1998), PGY1 Pharmacy (established 1991), PGY2-Health System Pharmacy Administration (established 2010), PGY2-Oncology (established 2011), and PGY2-Pharmacy Informatics (established 2011). The accreditation survey for the PGY1/PGY2 Administration/MS Degree residency took place in May 2013 and will be reviewed at the August 2013 Commission on Credentialing Meeting. In July of 2013, the first PGY-2 resident in Solid Organ Transplant will begin (see page 2). The accreditation status of the program is currently "Pre-Candidate". All programs are registered with the National Matching Service (NMS). Residency program directors are listed on page 5.
