Internal Medicine

Ms. White is the Pharmacy Clinical Coordinator in Ambulatory Care and a clinical assistant professor for the VCU School of Pharmacy. Currently, she serves an Internal Medicine Clinic, where patients are referred for hypertension, diabetes, hyperlipidemia, anticoagulation, and tobacco cessation. She also serves in the Diabetes Cardiology clinic as well as a Hospital Follow Up clinic focusing on TOC and decreasing Hospital readmissions. She has been instrumental in initiating and implementing a University wide population health program where UVA pharmacists complete medication reconciliation on all insured employees and their families. She received her BS in Pharmacy from MCV/VCU and has been a Certified Diabetes Educator since 1998 and is certified in immunization delivery and Medication Therapy Management. Ms. White received the VCU class of 2010 Mentor Award and a Fall Preceptor Award from VCU in 2006. In addition to her areas of practice, her other interests include geriatrics, health literacy and patient safety.

Infectious Diseases

Dr. Buscemi is an Infectious Diseases Clinical Pharmacist. Her primary practice site is the Ryan White HIV Clinic where she works with an extensive multidisciplinary team to provide service to patients living with HIV/AIDS. She also provides service to the Traveler's Clinic, General Infectious Diseases Clinics, Hepatitis C clinic, and UVA Antimicrobial Stewardship Team. She received her PharmD from the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia (formerly Philadelphia College of Pharmacy). She completed both her ASHP-accredited PGY1 Pharmacy Residency and ASHP-accredited PGY2 Infectious Diseases Pharmacy Residency at Barnes-Jewish Hospital in St. Louis, MO. She is a member of the Antimicrobial Utilization Committee and the Ryan White HIV Clinic Quality Committee. Family Medicine
